Here are a few highlights from the *Big Dig 2016*!

Chester County Cemetery Project:

- Cemetery materials from many parts of the collection re-filed into one system
- All materials rehoused using acid-free materials and boxes
- Index created, including information on location, denomination, etc.
- Cemetery plot maps rehoused in the reading room for easy access
- Fragile plot maps encapsulated in mylar

Digital viewing station for easy in-house access to:

- Family bible records
- Passmore Williamson's prison visitors' book
- Gilpin register and Hopewell Cotton Works sample book
- Maps and atlases
- Searchable finding aids for CCHS manuscript and photograph collections
- New index to the cemetery collection
- Chester County place names index (for access to the map collection)

- Processed using acid-free materials and best practices
- Finding aid created

Church materials reorganized by denomination:

- Rehoused using acid-free folders and boxes
- Reorganized by denomination
